President's Report



Thank you for attending the Parklea EDFNL 2023 Grand Final. Hope you enjoy the day!

Congratulations and all the best to all the football and netball teams participating today. Unfortunately, there can only be one winner across the 10 levels of competition but as far as I am concerned any team that makes it to the last day of the season must judge it a successful year.

From a league view we had yet another positive year. The numbers were better across all football grades and off field the club and league administrators did a fantastic job to ensure things ran smoothly. On the league administration side, this year I can confidently say we rose to new heights. Tim Cosstick did yet another outstanding job assisting clubs with the Play HQ system and newcomer Tanya Helliar has enhanced our social media, the publicity for sponsors and recently produced a new league website. The Follower is now available on our league website and Instagram and via a QR at each ground thanks to Tanya.

Last Sunday we held the 2023 Junior and Senior presentation functions. Congratulations to Poowong's Jack Hazendonk & Trafalgar's Dylan Farrell who tied in the Alf Walton medal count for the Senior Best & Fairest. Remarkably it was the fourth time Jack was won and the second time for Dylan. Well done to Neerim Neerim South who achieved back-to-back Robin Hood Club Championship awards along with Nilma Darnum who won the Parklea Most Disciplined Club award at Senior level and Ellinbank who won it at Junior level. Jack Hazendonk had a big night also taking home the Relink Consulting 'Most Valuable Player' award and Nilma Darnum was the recipient of the Warragul Downtowner 'Community Club of the year.'

We fielded 8 & 9 teams respectively at U16 &18 level this year which was an improvement on the 2022 season, and I was really pleased with the feedback after the league once again opted to organise an U16 East v West match followed by an Interleague match

against the WGFNC. While time consuming for all involved and an expensive initiative, the Board of Management see it as an investment rather than a cost as we don't want kids disengaged from football.

As you may know I intend to stand down from the league Presidency – a role I have occupied for 35 years – at the upcoming AGM in November but still intend to be on the Sub-Committee.

I'd like to think over my tenure the league has ran successfully, progressed to be more professional and never reform shy. The friendships forged over the years are priceless and far than outweigh the issues along the journey. As you may know some clubs have made enquiries to join our league in 2024. It is too early to say whether another team will be accepted into the EDFNL, but I would just like to reiterate that to be a sustainable league we must stay ahead of the game and if that means taking on new clubs, I think this is the way to go — all be it clubs that will add value to our league.

Grand Final Preview - Football



The 2023 minor premiers Buln Buln will be out to put the ghosts of last season's one-point Grand Final loss behind them when they meet Neerim Neerim South once again. The match has all the elements of a classic. The Lyrebirds took all before them in the home and away season while the Cats are riding on the crest of a wave with three consecutive wins this final series. Buln Buln is chasing their 11th flag and first since they won the 2014 East division premiership and the Cats its ninth.

It is a massive day for the Neerim Neerim South who will be represented in all four matches.

The match pits the two most attacking and miserly defensive teams which suggests the side with the superior midfield on the day will hold the premiership cup aloft.

Buln Buln was a cut above all comers this season. It boasted the most settled team with nine players having played all matches as opposed to only four at Neerim South. However the Cats aside from emerging forward Tom Crole and star veteran Chris Urie (quad - doubtful) should be close to full strength. Likewise Buln Buln with the return of experience half back Sam Batson, for only his 2nd senior match of the season in round 19.

Compared with 2022 Buln Buln look a better team on paper with the arrival of ruck rover Mitch Nobelius, who has returned after a decade at Warragul, ex-Longwarry speedster Riley Rundell and former Nilma Darnum wingman Dylan Cann. The Lyrebirds average 21 points more per match this year. One could argue Neerim Neerim South is also a better team this year with the presence of ex-Bunyip forward Jack Blakey, who has added midfield drive and pace.

For Buln Buln, Nobelius, veteran ruck duo coach Bob McCallum and Matt Gray will trouble the Cats talls while centreman Trent Baker, goal sneak Hayden Baker and emerging star Brendan Wall will play a big role in their fortunes. For Neerim, it too has a rising star in Ayden Ramm while Captain Kody Wilson, Nathan Bayne and Tyssen Morrow to name just a few will have a big say in the outcome. Neerim to go back-to-back in another thriller. The Cats look to have more avenues to attack and have peaked at the right time.

RESERVES - NEERIM NEERIM SOUTH v LANG LANG

Lang Lang will attempt to win their second reserves flag and first since 2002, which is the only premiership the Tigers have won since it joined the EDFL/EDFNL in 2001. It will have to do it the hard way though having come through from the elimination final. It boasts four of the top ten goal kickers in the competition led by Laim Hetherington (40), Jesse Hand (32), Geordie Wells (24) & Mitch Tribuzi (20). For the Cats Adam White, Fletcher Robertson-Edgar, Tom Zeldrynk, Harry Notman & Aaron Mitchell have been their mainstays and will shape the course of the match.

U18s - NEERIM NEERIM SOUTH v ELLINBANK

Will be a ripping contest. For Neerim the form of midfield dynamo and 2023 Bill Cumming medallist Jay Ladson, Jackson Williames, Isaac Guy, Chad Owen and Lincoln Morehu has all made a strong contribution to their minor premiership while for Ellinbank Jack Champion, Rick Rosser and Pat Alger have been prime movers. With the availability of Liam Lisle, who has played the entire season in the seniors and the return last week of key forward Billy Auldist from long term injury the Eagles are not without a big chance.

U16s - ELLINBANK v NEERIM NEERIM SOUTH

Shapes as a close contest with by far the two top teams all season. For those to arrive early keep an eye on Ellinbank's Logan Joyce – the 2023 Ian Cooper medallist – Hugh Cunningham (33 goals this year), Vincent Onslow (30), Joel Armstrong, Ayden Clarke and Jhy Good who all have bright futures while for Neerim, Kai Mounsey (68 goals) and the U16 leading goalkicker, Kyson Cornwall, Braiden Curtis-Smith, Max Williames and Ash Mounsey are all players to watch.







Netball Grand Final Preview



In the first season of the amalgamated Ellinbank & District Football Netball League, we'll see reigning Premiers and Champions Neerim South take on the ever-consistent Ellinbank in the A Grade Grand Final.

Neerim South will go into the match as raging favourites having not lost a game since the "Covid half season" of 2021. Banked heavily on Jordan Anderson, Dylan Heylen and spring heeled ruck Travis Stewart (24 goals) for its spark. Wingman Jack Rosenow, Finlay Cousins and Connor Thompson all showed plenty. Its defence often buckled far too easily and an area to address in 2024.

LONGWARRY - 8th & 6 wins

Leading goal kicker - Jedd Serong (42)

Put in too many sub par efforts after it lost playmaker Russell Lehmann in the first third of the season. New recruit Darren Granger was outstanding all over the field. Congratulations to Poowong ruck rover Jack Hazendonk and Trafalgar ruckman Dylan Farrell who tied for the 2023 Alf Walton medal for the EDFNL senior best and fairest which was held at the Warragul Downtowner last Sunday. Quite extraordinary it was Hazendonk's fourth medal after winning in 2018 (a tie with Russell Lehman) and then outright in 2019 & 2022. The 28-year-old joined Poowong in 2017 where he has now played 106 matches and kicked 150 goals since crossing from Devon Meadows in the MPNFL. Jack runs himself and opponents ragged, always shows courage and unflinching desire and just keeps taking himself to a new level each year. He joins Nyora's Scott Wightman as the only other four-time winner. (1982, 83, 84 & 87) For Farrell, the Trafalgar captain, it was his second Alf Walton medal after winning in 2021. Now 29 years of age, Dylan hails from Trafalgar and introduced himself to our league in 2016 when he played a season at Buln Buln before three seasons at Moe before he rejoined the Bloods where he has played 134 games and kicked 70 goals. Close to, if not the tallest player in the league his mobility belies his size. His leadership, tap work, strong hands and ability to read play and double as a forward target has caused rivals many a headache this season and for that matter in 2022 when he was runner up in the Walton medal.

Times have changed over the tenure of EDFNL President Roger Gwynne



Many would be interested to know that current EDFNL President Roger Gwynne has announced he is stepping down from his current role and the Board of Management (BOM) at the upcoming 2023 Annual General Meeting (AGM). Such is his devotion to the league he still intends to join the Subcommittee in 2024. It is only fair we acknowledge Roger's tenure and contribution to the league, and we sincerely thank him and offer best wishes for the future. The league will release on our social media a more substantial piece on Roger's extensive and colourful career and his strong input towards the healthy state of the now EDFNL around the time of the AGM in late November.

However, this editorial is mainly to relate the change in football, the league and associated administration matters over the time Roger was involved.

With time, especially for the baby boomers, we forget how much things have changed so quickly. Roger started as Nyora delegate in the eighties when Hallora-Strezlecki was in the league. He joined the league executive in 1988 and took over the President role in 1994, the year after Longwarry joined the EDFL. Thus, his first decade predated smartphones, the internet was in its infancy and only PC nerds had heard of the Word Wide Web. Of course, there was no such thing as photoshop, drones, DVDs, play station, Facebook and iPhone.

Quizzing Roger on the most noticeable differences in the league when he commenced on the executive he said, "the 30-mile radius rule, shockingly muddy grounds, poor facilities and a delegate system," come to mind, adding "Poowong had a wood fire stove to heat up their water and there was no such thing as goal padding. At one club the players had to share the same shower. We were part of the VCFL not AFL Vic Country, everything was paperwork based,

there was a 19th & 20TH man and no red and yellow card system."

Roger, now 76 years of age, somewhat not surprisingly believes there is an over dependence on technology and a lack of face-to-face interaction. To all the younger folk that read this, it is difficult to disagree modern technology has produced greater productivity and improvements in efficiency, health and knowledge but it is a hard sell to many old timers who still make up a good deal of the EDFNL supporters.

Roger says the league administration has changed from "pastime to semi-professional" and the scale of the club and league responsibilities is infinitely far greater. He cites just this year as an example whereby clubs are required to have a Child Safety Officer, Volunteer Coordinator and our league must have a Match Review Panel.

Among other things to have changed since the late 1980s and 1990s we now have countless new laws of the game, a player point system, salary caps, code of conduct and a duty of care set by the AFL. A few clubs have OHS and social welfare officers and social media persons while accreditation for coaches and trainers and concussion protocols are compulsory. There are also many policies to abide by, perhaps the most notable being respect & responsibility and racial vilification and let's not forgot the AFL COVID protocols we had to follow in recent seasons.

Nonetheless Roger is adamant country grounds still retain their character and charm and football is still part of the fabric that binds many of our towns. He repeatedly states for all the changes over his time "good administrators and good people are the backbone of a successful club and clubs provide people with purpose and direction, and this will never change".

Can't disagree with these thoughts from Roger.
